

# Schreiner University

The following items are needed to complete your LSS application so your file can be reviewed:

- Transcripts – All freshmen and transfer candidates must submit an official high school transcript and transcripts of all academic work attempted at other colleges or universities attended.
- Diagnostic Statement – documentation from a qualified professional indicating that the applicant meets the criteria for dyslexia, attention deficit disorder or a specific learning disability. Recent ARD, IEP or Section 504 documentation from a high school can satisfy this requirement, as well as results from private testing by an educational diagnostician, psychologist, or medical doctor for attention deficit disorder diagnosis.
- Individual Achievement Test – The results from an individually administered achievement battery, such as the Woodcock-Johnson or Wechsler Individual Achievement Test, taken within one or two years of application are required only for students who do not meet the automatic admission requirements regarding ACT/SAT and GPA. Individual test scores (not cluster scores) must be included for reading comprehension, reading decoding and math computation. These results are used to help determine whether the student’s academic skills are sufficiently developed to support their success in a rigorous academic environment.
- Student Questionnaire – All students are required to submit the [LSS student questionnaire](#) to [admissions@schreiner.edu](mailto:admissions@schreiner.edu) or to the LSS Director as part of their application process. Use the QR code to download the questionnaire.
